In order to avoid misunderstanding as regards the placing of the asterisks, it should be pointed out that Briquet very often prefaces groups of marks with introductory commentaries in which he quotes the serial numbers of the marks discussed. In such cases asterisks have also been placed in the margin opposite the line in which the serial number is first mentioned.

The Addenda and Corrigenda are documented with details of the sources from which they proceed. These may take the form of the initials of the scholar who has supplied the information, or may be references to published books or articles. In the latter case bibliographical details are given if the source is not included in the Bibliography on pp. *37-*53; if the source is so included, then the author's name is followed by the serial number of the publication in the Bibliography in the form e.g. B320.
