They played an important role as papermakers in Basle. The marks originate from the same mill as No. 15146 and may be attrib. to either or both Antonio and Michael Galliziani [Tschudin (B305), pp. 107-17, wms Nos. 55-106; do. (B305A), pp. 10-11; idem in B9, pp. 354-5].

A gothic b was later added under the shield, its use extending to 1574. The P below the shield may stand for Pinette, an important paper merchant, who dealt with the Le Bés, or for Pierre Le Bé († 1546) owner of the mills where the wm. was used [Le Clert (B163), pp. 476 seq.].
