- p. 644b **12974.** Var. sim.: 29,5 × 44 r. 1399 (Gr. MS). VIENNA, NB: hist. gr. 39 [JI]. Irigoin questions Br.'s date: 'Montpellier, 1339' (cf. M.-T. 6771-3).
- p. 645a **12990.** Le Clerc (*B163*, p. 466) notes that Jean-sans-Peur, Duke of Burgundy—who at one time considered making Troyes the second capital of his realm—adopted the plane as an emblem. It figured as a badge on the livery of his men in about 1404.
- p. 645b l. 19 (No. 13011). Tentatively attrib. to the Halbysen mill, Basle [Piccard (*B306*), cols 295-6].
l. 9↑ (No. 13040). Marks of this kind may be attrib. to the Gouault family of Troyes, who bore three bunches of grapes in their arms ('gouais' = kind of vine). They supplied paper to Plantin of Antwerp [Le Clerc (*B163*), pp. 329, 469].

- 13047.** This Grape mark is 'exactly as' that in Rolewinck, *Fasciculus temporum* (Adam Alamanus, 2 Dec. 1486), 2°; Grape and Bull marks together (cf. AC, p. 197b, No. 2787), both from Piedmont, suggest that the printer was not near Naples but 'upon French soil' [V. Scholderer, 'Adam Alamanus' in: *Fifty Essays* (Amsterdam, 1966), pp. 179-82]. The conjunction of watermarks suggests some such town as Grenoble [AHS].

- p. 674a **Ste Face:** After Homme add Tête Humaine.
- p. 674b **13586-7.** Attrib. to the mill at Kremsmünster (Upper-Austria), founded 1542. The mark dates from about that year [*Ein.*, pp. 63-64, No. 54].
- p. 675b **Saucisson** (Nos. 13598 seq.). Represents a bale of merchandise, not a sausage. The sign appears in the coats of arms of Italian merchant-guilds. In those of Florence and Lucca the bale is corded once lengthwise and three times across (Br. 13598-601; 13603); in the Siena coat the bale is corded once lengthwise and only twice across. It is not known how the bale in the arms of the Fabriano guild was corded, but it was possibly like the one represented in No. 13599. The wm. was originally used in Tuscany, and was later adopted by papermakers from other regions, including Fabriano [Gasparinetti (*B43*), p. 33; Volpicella (*B260*) No. 114].

- p. 715b **Tête d'Âne.** Before adopting the bull's head, Ulman Stromer's mill at Nuremberg in all probability used a donkey's head mark for a short period [Piccard (*B99*), p. 27; Sporhan-Krempele (*B208*), col. 206].
