l. 17 (Nos. 15152 seq.). Bull's head/Tau mark attrib. to the Gallizianis (Antonio and his successors) of Basle, found from 1457 onwards (see Tschudin (B305)). The T resembles the papermakers' tool (the 'cross'), used for hanging up the sheets of paper to dry; it is also the symbol of St Anthony the Abbot, who was the patron saint of the papermakers in certain areas (e.g. the Vosges, and near Voltri W. of Genoa). The Gallizianis' mill was in the St Alban-Tal from 1453-1523, and in the monastery of the same name there was an altar dedicated to St Anthony the Abbot [WFT]. Piccard (B306, cols 294, 303) suggests that the T represents the Tau-staff of Moses (especially in combination with the serpent), used as a prophylactic sign against the plague (Heinrich Halbsen, the Elder, at whose mill the Gallizianis were employed before they started their own business had incidentally been one of the victims of the Basle epidemic of 1451). In cols 303-8 Piccard gives details of over 100 incunabula and early 16th c. books on Bull's Head/Tau paper.
